

General Information about the ISU Constitution Exam

Format:

The ISU Constitution Exam consists of two tests. Both of the tests are composed entirely of multiple-choice questions. One test is on the U.S. Constitution and consists of 35 questions. To pass the test, you have to get 60% of the questions correct. You have to give the correct answer to 21 of the 35 questions. The other test is on the Illinois Constitution and consists of 25 questions. To pass this test, you also have to get 60% of the questions correct. On the Illinois test, you have to provide correct answers to 15 of the 25 questions. To successfully fulfill the Illinois State graduation requirement by taking the Constitution Exam*, you have to pass both tests. If you pass one test and don't pass the other, then you just have to take the test that you didn't pass again.

*You can also meet this graduation requirement by the successful completion of certain courses as detailed in the [Illinois State Undergraduate Catalog](#) in the section *General Requirements for Graduation* that is part of the chapter on **Degree Requirements**.

Administration:

The Illinois State University Constitution Exam will be given at the University College Testing Services in Fell Hall, room 346. The Exam will be administered between the hours of 8:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. Monday-Friday. Students must contact the University College Testing Services to schedule an appointment. The \$5.00 fee will be charged to the student's account. Arrangements can be made for students who are disabled to take the Exam.
